My Liveable City (MLC) in partnership with the Musui Art Foundation (MAF) will host a three-day Conclave of Solutions at Tokaroun, Santiniketan from 28th to 30th November 2025.

Creating Public Spaces that bind through: Culture+Art Nature+Landscape History+Heritage

How Public Spaces Can Be Inclusive and Build Bridges

Inclusivity Through Art & Culture

'How to build bridges through art and culture' will be the topic of discussion with renowned sculptor **KS Radhakrishnan**, who graduated from Kala Bhavan, Santiniketan nearly five decades ago and continues to work there. **R.Sivakumar**, who has written extensively on Santiniketan and Rabindranath Tagore will also give a talk. Legendary photographer **Raghu Rai** takes us through the art of capturing Public Spaces.

Indo-Dutch urban designer **Shyam Khandekar** will expound how waterbodies can be used as temporary public spaces.

Inclusivity Through Nature & Landscape

'Working with nature and landscape' will be discussed by eminent landscape-urbanists **Kelly Shannon** (America) and **Bruno de Meulder** (Belgium), who teach at KU Leuven in Belgium. Environmentalist **Mohan Rao** will advocate the use of 'shared spaces' to build social and environmental resilience.

Inclusivity Through History & Heritage

History and heritage will be addressed by renowned urbanist **Vinayak Bharne** (University of Southern California, USA) and eminent heritage architect and director of CRCI **Gurmeet Sangha Rai** who is also a consultant with UNESCO. Conservation

architect **Kamalika Bose** who has worked on Chitpur Road Kolkata and **Saptarshi Sanyal**, architectural historian and conservation architect who has extensively researched Santiniketan, will also present their work.

Inclusivity: Public Spaces for All

Following these presentations, the accessibility of Public Spaces for All as a "janmasiddha adhikaar" (birth right) will be stressed in a speech by the well-known activist-artist (name to be confirmed), while specifically gender-related issues will be stressed upon by **Maartje van Eerd** of IHS, Erasmus University Rotterdam. This will be followed by a series of short presentations of unique initiatives from various parts of the country such as **Vadodara** (Alembic City), **Mumbai** (Somaiya Campus), **Kolkata** and others.

The Masterclass Exercise

MLC Academy will offer as a bonus to all registered for the Conclave — the possibility to take part in a short Masterclass which will be held at the end of each of the three days. Those keen to attend the Masterclass must indicate this while registering for the Conclave. No additional fees will be payable. The Masterclass will involve participants working in small groups to Design Public Spaces, surveying a selected area and identifying the possibilities of reshaping it through programme, design and management so that they can be more inclusive. These sessions will be conducted under the guidance and supervision of the My Liveable City team of Urbanist Vinayak Bharne, Urban Designer and Planner Shyam Khandekar, Landscape Architects Subhagya Atale Raval and/or Aarti Grover and Urban Designers Adarsha Kapoor and/ or Karna Sengupta.

The conclave will end with a broad panel discussion leading to a document containing the conclave recommendations.

UNESCO World Heritage site

Santiniketan

Santiniketan, meaning "abode of peace," is a neighborhood in the town of Bolpur, located in the Birbhum district of West Bengal, India. It is approximately 152 km north of Kolkata.

It was established by Maharshi Devendranath Tagore, and later expanded by his son, the Nobel laureate Rabindranath Tagore. He developed Santiniketan into a renowned educational and cultural institution based on ancient Indian traditions and a vision of human unity transcending religious and cultural boundaries. Rabindranath Tagore's vision became what is now a university town with the creation of Visva-Bharati. It is also the birthplace of Indian Nobel Laureate Amartya Sen, who was also an alumnus of the school.



It was inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List by the World Heritage Committee in 2023.

Why Santiniketan as the conclave venue?

The earlier conferences of MLC in India have been held in Delhi, Mumbai (twice) and last year in Bengaluru. Having covered north, west and south India in this way, we were keen - as a pan-Indian/and international organisation to hold the next conclave in the Eastern part of India.

The topic of this year's conclave builds on the discussions we had in our last conclave which was to create INCLUSIVITY through SLOW and HEALTHY CITIES for ALL.

The forthcoming conclave focuses on achieving INCLUSIVITY through PUBLIC SPACES - made accessible to all through CULTURE & ART, NATURE & LANDSCAPE and HISTORY & HERITAGE.

Considering the scope of the topic, Santiniketan was clearly the most obvious choice. With its inclusive vision of humanity transcending religious and cultural boundaries. Santiniketan is an embodiment of Rabindranath Tagore's vision and philosophy of where 'the world would form a single nest' using a combination of education, appreciation of nature, music and the arts.

Santiniketan was an experimental settlement in education and communal life in a rural setting. The community was in many ways meant to represent a uniquely Indian example of a 'total work of art' (Gesamtkunstwerk) where life, learning, work and art intertwined seamlessly.

The built and open spaces constitute an exceptional global testimony to ideas of environmental art and educational reform where progressive education and visual art are intertwined with architecture and landscape.

Wanting to avoid the hubbub of Kolkata or another major city, Santiniketan seemed the most obvious choice for the topic of our conclave.
