Programme description & features

The MSc in Urban Management and Development is a 1-year English-taught multidisciplinary programme featuring two master tracks offered by IHS, Erasmus University Rotterdam, providing students with the knowledge and skills to tackle complex urban challenges and shape sustainable, resilient cities.

Cities are constantly evolving. By 2050, more than two-thirds of the global population will live in urban areas, generating social, economic, environmental, and spatial challenges. The programme prepares students to analyse these dynamics and contribute to inclusive, forward-looking urban policies worldwide.

Students can deepen their knowledge through one of two specialisations while tailoring their studies to their own interests through diverse focal points within each track. This flexible, transdisciplinary structure allows students to design a programme that fits their professional goals and engage with the urban issues they are most passionate about.


A key feature of the programme is its comparative and practice-oriented approach, which connects theory with real-world cases from cities around the globe. Students develop analytical, communication, and data skills to tackle contemporary urban challenges and apply their learning in hands-on contexts, preparing them for leadership roles in urban development worldwide.

Facilitators

Together with its partners, IHS works at the forefront of urban development, advising governments, training public service staff, and contributing to global discussions on the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Collaborating with international leaders such as UN-Habitat, Cities Alliance, ICLEI, and top universities worldwide, IHS brings a unique mix of academic expertise and practical experience into teaching. Students benefit from faculty insights drawn from real-world urban projects, gaining exposure to global trends and local solutions preparing them to implement solutions for city-level challenges worldwide.

International

The IHS classroom is highly diverse, with students from over 35 countries and multiple disciplines, including architecture, planning, engineering, economics, and social and environmental sciences. Many participants bring experience from public and private sectors, NGOs, and international organisations, creating a rich environment where multiple perspectives intersect. This global mix fosters cross-cultural collaboration, peer learning, and professional networking, equipping students to develop adaptable, context-sensitive solutions to urban challenges worldwide.



Teaching methods

IHS teaching combines theory, research, and practice to equip students with the skills to analyse and manage complex urban systems.

Faculty bring insights from real-world urban projects worldwide, while students learn through lectures, case studies, simulations, group projects, and written assignments. The programme emphasises evidence-based planning using urban data, preparing students to tackle contemporary urban issues. Students also benefit from collaborative exercises that simulate real urban decision-

making processes, fostering problem-solving, critical thinking, and teamwork skills.

A key feature is the project-based master's thesis, with opportunities for fieldwork in Chennai, India, or Nairobi, Kenya. Field visits and projects in Rotterdam provide hands-on experience with city planning, governance, and sustainability, linking classroom learning to tangible urban transformations. Students graduate ready to apply practical, analytical, and collaborative skills to urban development challenges around the world.
