Inclusive, innovative, and socially just cities are essential for addressing the complex challenges of contemporary urban life. This specialisation evaluates various policies, approaches, and instruments to promote equitable development, effective governance, and resilient urban environments worldwide.

What will I learn?

The programme offers students the opportunity to examine the driving forces behind urban change, from economic transformations and technological innovation to social inequality and governance challenges. Students explore key topics such as urban planning and governance, land and housing policies, and the digitalisation of cities. Through a combination of theoretical frameworks, case studies, and practical applications, participants gain insights into how cities evolve and how policies and interventions can shape more equitable urban futures.

Throughout the specialisation, participants look at the impact that urban innovation, land justice and urban governance have on building smart and inclusive cities. These perspectives are complemented by a focus on gender and social justice.

Besides developing management and governance expertise, students explore a combination of core modules and focal points during the specialisation period.
